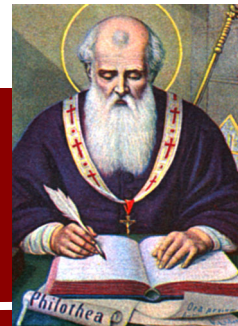

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

The feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is a popular Catholic observance. It began with the devotion to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus from the apostolic times. The feast developed through many centuries. Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in France in 1673 and requested a special devotion to his Sacred Heart. The feast got universal acceptance after this vision. It also relates to other devotions of Jesus like the First Friday Devotion, the feasts of Corpus Christi, the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and the Divine Mercy. The symbols on the image of the Sacred Heart are worthy of reflection. In the Bible we see these references to the Sacred Heart of Jesus: (John 19:30) Jesus took the wine and said, "It is now fulfilled."



Then he bowed his head and gave up the spirit. (31) As it was Preparation Day, the Jews did not want the bodies to remain on the cross during the Sabbath, for this Sabbath was a very solemn day. They asked Pilate to have the legs of the crucified broken, so they might take away the bodies. (32) The soldiers came and broke the legs of the first man and of the other who had been crucified with Jesus. (33) When they came to Jesus, they saw that he was already dead; so they did not break his legs (34) Instead, one of the soldiers thrust a lance into his side and immediately there flowed out blood and water. (35) This testimony is given by one who saw it; his testimony is true and he knows that he is telling the truth. This man gives his witness so that you may believe as well. (36) All this happened to fulfill the words of Scripture, not one of his bones shall be broken. (37) Another text says, they shall look on the one whom they have pierced.

We need to understand the devotion to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus which is celebrated all through June and is reflected in the stained glass window behind our altar has a Biblical foundation, a historical growth in Catholicism, and symbolic perspectives that have led to personal and communal devotions. Sacred Heart of Jesus help us to always live to love you have shared with the world, for as you said to the Apostles, "It is Mercy I desire, not sacrifice."

I would like to thank our Cemetery Council for the wonderful celebration out at St. Francis de Sales Cemetery this past weekend for Memorial Day. It was great to see so many from the Parish, starting with the small but potent choir of Michael Deane, Martha Cucco and Laura Zappitelli as they guided us in song and celebration. And the readers and ministers such as Maureen Redmeer, Rita Popelka and of course all of the Cemetery Committee to help us and guide us. Not just thanks to all for the day but also to the Cemetery Committee who continue to improve the many aspects of the Cemetery itself. Blessing to all and everyone

As our graduating students from St. Francis de Sales move forward into the future together with all of our students of our Parish graduating this



year I would like to share a powerful quote from the Patron Saint of Education: St. Thomas Aquinas, Doctor of the Church. I share his sentiment on education based on what I sense in the general community of the narrowing in our world of understanding new thought processes and ways to accomplish things.

The growth among people in our lack and inability to tolerate and act civil with those who differ from our own understanding of life including in the Church itself is troublesome when it comes to the message of the Gospel. There are more and more schools that are threatened by groups specifically within the student body itself that may not agree with a speaker, or whose ideology strongly differs from their own, and will go to all ends not to allow the other's presence or vocally lack toleration of the other.

To deal civilly and compassionately with another does not mean you agree with them, it means that you see them as the family of God. Hence St. Thomas stated, "We must love them both, those whose opinions we share and those whose opinions we reject, for both have labored in the search for truth, and both have helped us in finding it."

From this point I would spring board to another point with my students with this little statement for my future leaders in society. "There are many people who are satisfied with being a large fish in a small pond. Remember anyone can find a pond small enough to be a big fish! True leaders are those who are big fish in the Ocean. Then you truly shine with ALL your potential."

Dear graduates and parents of graduates, help each other to become big fish in the ocean, and because it is an ocean, unlike a small pond there are many different fish in the Ocean. Hence like Saint Thomas said, learn from all the fish in the big ocean, then you will truly be wise in your judgments and not just narrow minded in "Right Judgment" the gift of the Holy Spirit. The season of Easter concludes with today's celebration, the feast of Pentecost. On Pentecost we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem; this event marks the beginning of the Church. The story of Pentecost is found in the Acts of the Apostles, today's first reading.



The account in today's Gospel, taken from the Gospel of John, also recounts how Jesus gave the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples. There is no need to try to reconcile these two accounts to each other. It is enough to know that, after his death, Jesus fulfilled his promise to send to his disciples a helper, an advocate, who would enable them to be his witnesses throughout the world.

We previously heard today's Gospel on the second Sunday of Easter. At that time, we also heard the passage that follows, which describes Jesus' appearance to Thomas. In that context, we were led to reflect on belief and unbelief. In the context of the feast of Pentecost, this reading reminds us about the integral connection between the gifts of peace and forgiveness and the action of the Holy Spirit. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." As he breathes the Holy Spirit upon them, Jesus sends his disciples to continue his work of reconciliation through the forgiveness of sins.

This Gospel reminds us that the Church is called to be a reconciling presence in the world. This reconciling presence of Christ is celebrated in the Church's sacramental life. In the Sacrament of Baptism, we are washed clean from sin and become a new creation in Christ. In the Sacrament of Penance, the Church celebrates the mercy of God in forgiving sins. This reconciling presence is also to be a way of life for Christians. In situations of conflict, we are to be agents of peace and harmony among people. Many the Blessings of the Holy Spirit guide you in all things!
